

WESTON HISTORIC LANDMARKS COMMISSION

Sept 20, 2016

Approved Minutes

Called to order at 7:00 p.m.

Bob welcomed Angel as the newest member of the commission.

Members present: Bob Gilliland, John Holte, Angel Sutton, Sheldon Delph, Heidi Scott Delph, and Tim Crampton as liaison. Both Heidi and Sheldon were proven to be available by phone.

Minutes of the meeting of July 19 were read and approved with one spelling correction, "to date" for "too date".

Bob said that he still considers Angel a Weston resident, even though she is living in Pendleton temporarily for the winter.

Bob said the only development on the grants was Sheldon said the grant for work on the Long Branch was unsuccessful but he thought there was a work around available.

Bob asked if we should offer a guided tour of downtown next year, or just post the data on the buildings. Angel thought we should offer both, as we did this year, in that the interactive aspect of the guided portion was valuable. Tim asked if we are intending to expand the tour. He reminded us that when the rail car club came to town a bus was used to provide them a tour of the entire town and it was well received. We agreed to look at that when we are comfortable with touring downtown.

Bob mentioned that the folks at PARC would like to post historical info on their building. He also mentioned that the owners of what was the D&F Café are moving into the apartment in the rear, and the front will be a coffee and handicraft shop. Everyone agreed to offer our downtown brochure to downtown businesses. We already have some at Central. They even have the historical brochure at each table. Tim mentioned that the historical binder at Central appears to be read quite often.

After discussion, Angel moved that we use some of the binders we have to make up some more binders to have on display at Central and possibly the Long Branch. The motion was seconded and carried. Tim suggested we use some time during a meeting to assemble the binders. Everyone agreed.

John asked if Sheldon would continue his grant work. He said his wife, Fancy, has experience in the field if we need help.

We discussed the liability issues of the bricks following off the Long Branch. We agreed that the Commission should not get involved.

A question was asked if we wanted to do anything special for Potato Show. We discussed the show for our new members. No decision was made.
